ALLEGATION:

Staff left Resident A unsupervised in van in grocery store parking lot.

INVESTIGATION:

Resident A was not interviewed for this investigation since he is non-verbal.

I interviewed Stephanie Harris on 11/15/18 and she stated on 11/13/18 direct care staff Darius Harris drove the agency van with Resident A on board to run work related errands. She stated Darius Harris made the decision to leave Resident A unattended in the agency van while he ran into Meijer's to pick up a prescription. Apparently, Darius Harris forgot to take the van keys or dropped them in the van, so when he came out Meijer's (the prescription ended up being at Kroger's instead), the

van and Resident A were gone. According to the incident report completed by Darius Harris on 11/13/18, the van had been driven by Resident A (who does not have a driver's license according to John Cornack) into a stop sign, over the curb and onto the median at the nearby McDonald's parking lot where the local police were investigating the scene.

According to the incident report completed by Valerie Warthen on 11/13/18, she coincidentally was arriving at the McDonald's just as the police were investigating the incident and she assisted them by contacting the office. The ambulance transported Resident A to the hospital ER and a staff member went to the hospital with Resident A's medication list and medication history. Resident A was unharmed and discharged back to the facility.

I conducted an exit conference with John Cornack on 11/15/18. He stated that although Darius Harris is an exemplary staff, he'll be disciplined somewhere between a lengthy suspension to having his employment terminated.

APPLICABLE RULE	
R 400.15303	Resident care; licensee responsibilities.
	(2) A licensee shall provide supervision, protection, and personal care as defined in the act and as specified in the resident's written assessment plan.
ANALYSIS:	This incident was the consequence of bad decision making and negligent actions by Darius Harris. By choosing to leave a resident unsupervised and not securing the van keys, the licensee did not provide supervision and protection as defined in the act and as specified in the resident's written assessment plan.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend no change in the status of the license.
