II. Purpose of Addendum

The facility requested a former area of the current home for the aged be converted to a memory care unit with 21 beds. This addendum converts this general area to a 15-bed memory care unit. Lowering the total capacity to 77 beds.

III. Methodology

Bureau of Fire Services provided an acceptable fire safety certification on 8/17/18. Health Facilities Engineering Section Engineer Pier-George Zaroni granted occupancy approval on 8/17/18. I conducted an inspection of memory care unit on 8/20/18.

IV. Description of Findings and Conclusions

This memory care unit is a distinct area connected to the home for the aged. It consists of 21 resident rooms, a main dining room (584 square feet) with an attached serving kitchenette, lounge (208 square feet), activity room (240 square feet), a staff work station with attached employee bathroom, staff laundry room, and dementia care program director office. The bathrooms connected to the resident rooms have a toilet and sink. Three resident rooms are barrier free. All common shared space in the unit are barrier free.

The door-frames around the bedroom doors are painted differing colors to help the memory care resident find their assigned room. There are also plaques outside each resident room that will note the resident's name. The living room, dining room and hallway is decorated with a neutral color scheme and beautiful nature photographs to promote a calming atmosphere.

The memory care program statement was reviewed and contained all items required by Statute.

The food for the memory care unit is prepared in a large kitchen located in the general area of the HFA then transported to the satellite kitchen in the memory care unit for serving.

This unit has four secured exits each requiring an electronic key-fob to unlock the doors. A secured courtyard is located next to the memory care unit for the resident's use. The entrance to the memory care unit, used by resident families and friends, has a door bell to alert the staff that a visitor wishes to enter the unit.

Residents will be allowed to participate in supervised exercise, devotions, reminisces, food preparation, and craft activities.

V. Recommendation


I recommend approval of this memory care unit with an overall lowering of the home for the aged licensed bed capacity to 77.
