III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This facility was found to be in non-compliance with the following rules:

R 325.1942	Resident records.
	(2) A home shall assure that a current resident record is maintained and that all entries are dated and signed.
ANALYSIS:	Review of several resident service plans revealed several did not contain the required signature page. I was therefore unable to determine whether any changes to the plan were communicated to the resident and/or their responsible person.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1976	Kitchen and dietary.
	(5) The kitchen and dietary area, as well as all food being stored, prepared, served, or transported, shall be protected against potential contamination from dust, flies, insects, vermin, overhead sewer lines, and other sources.
ANALYSIS:	Inspection of the walk-in refrigerator in the kitchen, as well as a freezer in the dining room common area, revealed there were food items left uncovered and open to the elements.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, renewal of the license is recommended.
