## **ALLEGATION:** Resident A is not allowed access to his cigarettes.

**INVESTIGATION:** On 01/06/2022, I spoke with staff member Chris Cutler regarding the above allegation. He reported that Resident A was limited to five cigarettes per day according to his guardian due to multiple issues regarding excessive lighters in his room and chain smoking.

On 01/06/2022, I spoke with Resident A's guardian Steve Meyers and inquired about the restrictions. He stated that it was not true that he restricted Resident A's use of cigarettes. He explained that Resident A is a heavy smoker and the licensee and staff members have reported many issues regarding his behavior and smoking. He could not remember exactly but he may have agreed with the licensee when presented with the idea of limiting his cigarettes. He reported however this was not directed to the licensee in writing through his assessment plan.

On 01/06/2022, I spoke with Licensee Suzie Lange who acknowledged she had restricted Resident A's cigarette use to five cigarettes per day. She stated his cigarettes were kept in the office and given out at intervals throughout the day. Her reason was that Resident A would frequently go out to the designated smoking area

and chain smoke. On at least one occasion he caught the container of cigarette butts on fire. Additionally, staff found 20 lighters in his room and Ms. Lange was concerned about the possibility of Resident A starting a fire. Ms. Lange also stated when she took Resident A to the doctor, and he complained of his shoulders and chest aching his doctor advised that he quit smoking or cut back due to health concerns. Ms. Lange acknowledged that she did not have the restriction on cigarettes written in Resident A's assessment plan and signed by Mr. Meyers. She stated when she reported concerns about Resident A's smoking to Mr. Meyers along with her proposal of the cigarette restriction, he told her to "Do whatever you have to do".

On 01/10/2022, I conducted an unannounced on-site investigation at the facility and interviewed Resident A and staff member Chris Cutler. Resident A stated he was only allowed to have five cigarettes per day, but he did not know why.

Mr. Cutler provided me with Resident A's file for review. Nothing was noted in his assessment plan or elsewhere in the file regarding a restriction of Resident A's cigarettes. Mr. Cutler stated Resident A's cigarettes are kept in the staff office and five cigarettes are given to Resident A throughout the day.

On 01/19/2022, I conducted an exit conference with Licensee Suzie Lange and reviewed the findings of the investigation. She stated she understood that in order to limit Resident A's cigarettes she must have this clearly written in his assessment plan and approved and signed by his guardian. Ms. Lange provided a corrective action plan indicating that she would complete a new assessment plan and have it signed by Resident A's guardian.

(2) A licensee shall respect and safeguard the residents rights specified in subrule (1) of this rule.	

ANALYSIS:	Resident A did not have reasonable access to his cigarettes which belong to him.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

# IV. RECOMMENDATION

An acceptable plan of correction has been received. I recommend the status of this license remain unchanged.
