## **III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS**

R 325.1913	Licenses and permits; general provisions.
	(3) The number of residents cared for in a home and the complement of resident beds shall not exceed the number authorized by the license, provisional license, or temporary nonrenewable permit.
ANALYSIS:	Review of the resident roster revealed two residents reside in room 133. The current license provision allots for one licensed bed for this room. The two residents exceed the number authorized by the license; therefore the facility is in violation.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1923	Employee's health.
	(2) A home shall provide initial tuberculosis screening at no cost for its employees. New employees shall be screened within 10 days of hire and before occupational exposure.
ANALYSIS:	Review of staff records revealed Employee A's tuberculosis screening is out of compliance. Employee A began work on 5/21/2021 and was not screened for tuberculosis until 10/25/2021. Tuberculosis screenings for all employees must be performed within 10 days of hire and before any occupational exposure.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1932	Resident medications.
	(1) Medication shall be given, taken, or applied pursuant to labeling instructions or orders by the prescribing licensed health care professional.

ANALYSIS:	During inspection it was revealed facility staff prepare Resident A's medications and leave the medication in Resident A's room unsecured until Resident A is ready to take the medications after dinner. Staff do not supervise Resident A's medication administration after dinner either. Resident A also does not have a physician order in place stating [they] are independent with medication management. Leaving unsecured medications in any resident room and without staff supervision during administration poses a significant risk of harm and is unsafe.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1954	Meal and food records.
	The home shall maintain a record of the meal census, to include residents, personnel, and visitors, and a record of the kind and amount of food used for the preceding 3-month period.
ANALYSIS:	Inspection revealed no evidence of a meal census record containing the kind and amount of food used for the preceding 3-month period.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1975	Laundry and linen requirements.
	(1) A new construction, addition, major building change, or conversion after November 14, 1969 shall provide all of the following:  (b) A separate clean linen storage room.
ANALYSIS:	Inspection revealed the clean linen storage on the second floor contained other items besides clean linens and was being used for storage closet. Only clean linens can be kept in the clean linen storage. This is to prevent cross-contamination.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1976	Kitchen and dietary.
	(13) A multi-use utensil used in food storage, preparation, transport, or serving shall be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized after each use and shall be handled and stored in a manner which will protect it from contamination.
ANALYSIS:	Inspection of the kitchen revealed missing and/or incomplete dish sanitization records for July 2023 to October 2023. It cannot be determined if the dish washer was thoroughly cleaned and sanitized after each use to protect from contamination.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1976	Kitchen and dietary.
	(6) Food and drink used in the home shall be clean and wholesome and shall be manufactured, handled, stored, prepared, transported, and served so as to be safe for human consumption.
ANALYSIS:	On-site inspection revealed multiple food items such as condiments, baking items, ice cream, sliced deli meats, frozen vegetables, and frozen fruit etc. were found in the kitchen freezer, employee lounge refrigerator, and common area kitchenettes. These items were not labeled with the appropriate open date, and it could not be determined if the food items were safe for human consumption. An open date must be placed on all food items in the facility once opened.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1979	General maintenance and storage.
	(3) Hazardous and toxic materials shall be stored in a safe manner.

ANALYSIS:	On-site inspection revealed industrial chemicals easily accessible to anyone on the first and second floor common area bathrooms and common area kitchenettes. This presents a potential risk of ingestion and harm to residents in the home with impaired cognition and function.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

#### IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, renewal of the license is recommended.
