III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This facility was found to be in non-compliance with the following rules:

R 325.1932	Resident medications.
	 (3) If a home or the home's administrator or direct care staff member supervises the taking of medication by a resident, then the home shall comply with all of the following provisions: (a) Be trained in the proper handling and administration of medication.
ANALYSIS:	Inspection of the memory care unit revealed Employee A left the medication cart unlocked and easily accessible to anyone in the facility. This poses a risk of harm for residents with impaired cognition.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

R 325.1976	Kitchen and dietary.	
	(6) Food and drink used in the home shall be clean and wholesome and shall be manufactured, handled, stored, prepared, transported, and served so as to be safe for human consumption.	
ANALYSIS:	On-site inspection revealed food items such as condiments, crackers, cereal, peanut butter, baking items, coffee creamer, juice, yogurt, milk, ice cream, chicken, noodles, fruit and caramel sauces etc. were found in the kitchen refrigerator, kitchen dry storage, the memory care refrigerator, the memory care cabinets, the employee lounge refrigerator and the employee lounge cabinets. These items were not labeled with the appropriate open date, and it could not be determined if the food items were safe for human consumption. An open date must be placed on all food items in the facility once opened.	
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED	

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, renewal of the license is recommended.
