## III. METHODOLOGY

11/20/2024	Special Investigation Intake 2025A0123008
11/21/2024	Special Investigation Initiated - On Site I conducted an unannounced on-site at the facility.
12/05/2024	APS Referral APS referral completed.
12/05/2024	Contact - Telephone call made I spoke with Relative 1 via phone.
12/10/2024	Exit Conference I conducted an exit conference with licensee Ayodele Ayanwale.

**ALLEGATION:** On an unknown date, there was a child lock covering the doorknob to the front door of the facility.

**INVESTIGATION:** On 11/21/2024, I conducted an unannounced on-site at the facility. I interviewed Resident A and licensee Ayodele Ayanwale. During this on-site I did observe a white plastic child lock covering the front door's doorknob.

Licensee Ayanwale was interviewed. Licensee Ayanwale stated that Resident A has dementia and elopes. The child lock was put in place because of this, but Resident A still knows how to open the door even with the child lock on the doorknob. Resident A is the only resident in the home. It was Relative 1's idea to use the child lock on the door.

Resident A was interviewed. Resident A was the only resident in the facility. Resident A appeared clean and appropriately dressed. Resident A stated that there is always a child lock on the front door. Resident A stated that it takes a minute, but they are able to get the door open anyway.

On 12/05/2024, I spoke with Relative 1 via phone. Relative 1 denied having any concerns regarding Resident A's care and is satisfied with Resident A's care. Relative 1 stated that Resident A will leave the home (elope), and Relative 1 is fine with the child lock on the door. Relative 1 stated that they are just trying to make sure Resident A stays safe at all times. Relative 1 was unsure if Resident A has a


case manager. Relative 1 stated that Resident A started the eloping behavior when Resident A moved into the facility a few months ago. Relative 1 stated that there has been no discussion about putting Resident A in a different setting, and Relative 1 stated they do not want Resident A to move. Relative 1 stated they visit a couple times a week and speaks with Resident A via phone regularly.

On 12/10/2024, I conducted an exit conference with licensee Ayodele Ayanwale via phone. I informed Licensee Ayanwale of the findings and conclusion. Licensee Ayanwale stated that the child lock was removed from the door on 11/21/2024.

<b>APPLICABLE RULE</b>	
<b>R 400.1426</b>	<b>Maintenance of premises.</b>
	<b>(1) The premises shall be maintained in a clean and safe condition.</b>
<b>ANALYSIS:</b>	<p>On 11/21/2024, I conducted an unannounced on-site at the facility. I observed the front door had a plastic child safety lock covering the front doorknob.</p> <p>Resident A and Licensee Ayodele Ayanwale were interviewed. Resident A stated that there is always a child lock on the door. Licensee Ayanwale reported that the child lock was to help prevent Resident A from eloping.</p> <p>On 12/05/2024, I spoke with Relative 1 who denied having any concerns regarding Resident A's care and acknowledge the use of the child lock on the door.</p> <p>There is a preponderance of evidence to substantiate a rule violation due to safety reasons as the facility was using a child lock on the front doorknob.</p>
<b>CONCLUSION:</b>	<b>VIOLATION ESTABLISHED</b>

#### IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon the receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend continuation of the AFC family home (capacity 1-3).
