ALLEGATION: Resident A currently has a rash all over his body from poor hygiene. He also arrived at school without being showered, with soiled briefs, smelled of urine and was frequently hungry.

INVESTIGATION: On 12/22/2025, an APS referral was received. The APS worker alleged that “Resident A currently has a rash all over his body from poor hygiene.”

The other allegations are that Resident A arrived at school without being showered, with soiled briefs and smelled of urine on 11/10/2025 and 11/17/2025.

On 1/15/2026, I interviewed the APS worker. She stated that she substantiated neglect because when she interviewed direct care staff, Bianca Gamble, on 11/26/2025, Bianca Gamble admitted to her that Resident A was not showered every day. Also, she stated that when she interviewed the facility nurse, she admitted that Resident A had a rash from being wet and was treated with Bacitracin. Finally, she said that she was not able to determine if Resident A had soiled briefs, smelled of urine and/or was frequently hungry on 11/10/2025 or 11/17/2025.

On 12/23/2025, I interviewed Resident A accompanied by Daniel Bogosian, licensee designee. Resident A is autistic and can only make vocalizations. He can however follow simple commands and he removed his shirt and pulled up his pantlegs as requested. I observed no rash anywhere on his body or any bruises/abrasions. He did not smell of urine, and his clothes were clean.

On 12/23/2025, I observed him to be clean and have on clean clothes. He appeared well nourished and in no distress. Direct care staff, Kiala Keyes, also stated that she showered Resident A last evening and noticed no rash or any other marks on his body. I rewarded his compliance with a Tootsie Roll pop.

On 12/23/2025, I interviewed Guardian A1. She stated she was notified about the allegations but was satisfied with Resident A's placement and services.

On 1/15/2026, I re-interviewed Daniel Bogosian and he stated that Resident A doesn't necessarily take a shower every day or change his clothes, as he is not required to do so either in his IPOS or in the AFC licensing rules. He also stated that Resident A had a rash back in November 2025 and it was treated by the facility nurse. Finally, he stated that even when Resident A is showered in the morning before school, he could have soiled himself while on the bus to school and if Resident A arrived at school hungry, then it's because he chose to not eat breakfast at Eisenhower Center.

On 1/16/2026, I interviewed direct care staff, Bianca Gamble. She stated that Resident A is prompted to shower every day and put on clean clothes, but he is not physically forced to shower daily or change his clothes as this would be a rights issue. She also said that he is given breakfast every day and she has no recollection of his complaining about being hungry.

On 1/16/2026, I interviewed Mrs. Hollenbeck, WISD teacher. She stated that Resident A has arrived at school in dirty clothes and he has arrived at school soiled on 13 of the last 15 school days. Additionally, she stated that he is usually hungry during school day. Finally, she stated that he had a rash on 11/17/2025, but the Eisenhower Center nurse took care of it in a timely manner.

On 1/16/2026, I interviewed David Hendrick, Moriah facility manager. He stated he no recollection of being contacted by the WISD staff regarding Resident A's care.

On 1/16/2026, I interviewed Matthew Hescheles, Moriah facility case manager. He stated that he had not been contacted by the WISD staff recently, as these allegations are from 2 months ago.

On 1/19/2026 and 2/4/2026, I contacted Leslie Murray, facility nurse. She stated that she was notified about Resident A's rash on 11/18/2025 and that she treated it with an antibiotic. She stated that it was dermatitis and had cleared up.

On 1/19/2026, I interviewed Daniel Bogosian and conducted an exit conference. He did not agree with Mrs. Hollenbeck's (WISD schoolteacher) claims that she notified Eisenhower Center facility staff regarding Resident A's personal care from 2 months ago and/or she was insinuating that his staff are lying about Resident A's care. Further, he reiterated that when Resident A is showered in the morning before school he could have soiled himself while on the bus going to school. Furthermore, he stated that even if Resident A arrived at school without being showered and/or he chose not eat breakfast if he did not like the food or wasn't hungry, and/or if he feels like wearing the same clothes, Resident A has the right not to take a daily shower, he does not have to eat the breakfast offered and/or he can wear the same clothes. Finally, he stated that the Eisenhower staff do not force residents to comply beyond their IPOS goals, AFC licensing rules, and/or ORR rules lest they be accused of AFC licensing and resident rights rules violations.

APPLICABLE RULE	
R 400.671	Resident care.
	(4) A licensee shall provide supervision, protection, and personal care as specified in a resident's assessment plan.
ANALYSIS:	At the time I observed Resident A, there were no issues with his clothing or hygiene, his rash had been appropriately treated by the Eisenhower facility nurse and he had no rash or other bruises/abrasions on his body. Also, he did not claim to be hungry. I found both Eisenhower Center staff and the WISD schoolteacher to be credible, therefore, the preponderance of the evidence is that licensee did not provide personal care, i.e., Resident A arrived at school soiled, as specified in Resident A's assessment plan.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Pending receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend no changes in the status of the license.
