III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

A. Physical Description of Facility

Sunrise of North Farmington has been continuously licensed as a home for the aged (HFA) since 2/2/2004. The facility is a two-story steel frame building that is located at 29681 Middlebelt Road in Farmington Hills. The building is fire suppressed and has elevators. Public restrooms and a café are all located on the first floor near the lobby area.

The HFA facility is divided into two units; general assisted living and memory care. Each unit has its own designated beauty salon and laundry area for the convenience of the staff and residents. The home has 75-bedroom units. Twenty-nine-bedroom units are located on first floor in a secured locked area for individual who has been diagnosed with Alzheimer disease or related condition. Each resident's room has an individual control unit to regulate the heating and cooling in the room. In addition, the resident rooms located on the second floor have a kitchenette that is equipped with a sink and refrigerator/freezer. Each resident room has an attached bathroom outfitted with a sink, shower, and toilet. The living areas are outfitted with a bed, dresser, and nightstand. Cable television and Wi-Fi

are available. Resident areas are equipped with emergency call systems that when activated alert staff via pagers worn on the person of the resident's need for assistance.

Sunrise of North Farmington serves individuals who are 55 years or older including those residents diagnosed with Alzheimer disease or related condition. The home provides 24 hours supervised and assistance with personal care including administration of medication. Many activities are provided, and these activities are based on the competency level of the residents. These activities include chair yoga, church service, exercise, bingo, movie and card games.

The memory care area consists of the secured unit. A card reader is utilized to enter and exit the unit. This method of protection is used to prevent those with poor safety awareness from leaving unsupervised. The physical environment within the memory care unit is designed to provide a less restrictive environment while ensuring the safety of the residents. For the safety of the residents, locks have been placed on windows throughout that prohibit opening more than four inches. A secure and enclosed courtyard is attached to the memory care unit that has an above ground garden box for planting herbs and vegetables. In addition, a walking path, chairs and tables are available to residents for activities and entertainment.

Meals for the entire facility will be prepared in the central commercial kitchen located on the first floor that is a licensed food establishment by the Oakland County Health Department. The meals are prepared and served to the two dining rooms throughout the facility.

Essential electrical equipment within the building are fully operational during an electrical outage by means of the emergency generator located onsite.

The Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs Bureau of Fire Services granted an acceptable annual certification on 1/24/19.

The facility is wheelchair accessible, uses public water and sewage disposal, and is a non-smoking building.

HCP Farmington Hills MI OpCo, LLC is the licensee of Sunrise of North Farmington Hills. The Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs Corporations Division Business Entity Search reveals it is a registered business. HCP Farmington Hills MI OpCo, LLC has designated Kristie Nagle as the authorized representative and administrator of the HFA facility

B. Program Description

The facility provides services to the individuals 55 years of age or older and to individuals that have been diagnosed with Alzheimer's/dementia or a related condition. The services provided include room, board, assistance with personal

care, including administration of medications, and twenty-four-hour supervision. Personal care and activities are designed with the residents' cognitive and physical capabilities in mind. Activities will be offered throughout the day and include; outings, shopping, musical entertainment, exercise, chair yoga, painting, card games, bingo, etc. The facility will make available regularly scheduled group activity transportation, at no extra charge, for shopping trips to selected local malls and shopping centers. Individual transportation to appointments and errands will be on fee for service basis.

Staffing of the facility is based on the care needs of the residents and adjustments will be made as needed. Staff members will complete policy and procedure trainings, online *Relias* training, and disaster plan trainings. Continuing education will be presented through staff meetings and in-services. Each staff member's competencies will be evaluated by written testing, oral testing, and shadowing by the administrator or designee.

C. Rule/Statutory Violations

The study has determined substantial compliance with applicable licensing statutes and administrative rules.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that issuance of a temporary license enabling the licensee to operate an HFA for 75 residents for a six-month period.


