ALLEGATION: Resident A was denied an opportunity for educational programming.

INVESTIGATION: I interviewed Resident A on 7/30/21 and he stated he was given

the opportunity to attend school, but he refuses to do so. He also stated he does not like living at this placement.

APPLICABLE RULE	
R 400.14303	Resident care; licensee responsibilities.
	(5) A licensee shall provide both of the following when specified in the resident's written assessment plan: (b) An opportunity for involvement in educational, employment, and day programs.
ANALYSIS:	Since the licensee provided Resident A the opportunity to attend school and he chose not to attend, there is no evidence of a violation.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION NOT ESTABLISHED

ALLEGATION: Resident A was denied meals/snacks if he did not complete a daily exercise routine.

**INVESTIGATION:** I interviewed Resident A on 7/30/21 and he stated the second shift staff make him exercise, i.e., walk laps around the parking lot to get meals and snacks. He stated if he does not exercise, he does not get any food.

I interviewed Javon Reese, Eisenhower Center program coordinator on 7/30/21, and he stated staff verbally prompt Resident A to exercise, but if he doesn't comply/exercise, the staff were withholding food.

APPLICABLE RU	LE
R 400.14308	Resident behavior interventions prohibitions.
	(2) A licensee, direct care staff, the administrator, members of the household, volunteers who are under the direction of the licensee, employees, or any person who lives in the home shall not do any of the following:  (e) Withhold food, water, clothing, rest, or toilet use.
ANALYSIS:	Although Resident A and the facility staff may differ on their interpretations of whether Resident A was verbally prompted or verbally coerced into exercising, staff cannot withhold food as part of a behavioral intervention. Therefore, the preponderance of credible evidence is that the direct care staff did withhold food, even if it was just evening snacks, from Resident A when he did not comply with requests from staff to exercise.

CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED	
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ALLEGATION: Resident B was not given his medications before school as prescribed.

**INVESTIGATION:** Resident B was unavailable to be interviewed and this allegation did not require his input.

I reviewed Resident B's medication records for July 2021, and this documentation indicated that he was not given his AM medications on 7/13, 7/15 and 7/21.

I interviewed Gwen Hoover Washtenaw County Intermediate School District nurse on 7/23/21 and she stated Resident B's 8:00 AM medications were missed on 7/13, 7/15, and 7/21. She stated an Eisenhower staff would bring out the missed medications within an hour, but they did not identify themselves, had no staff ID, and brought the medications loose in a paper cup. She stated the school staff do not know what the medications are and are uncomfortable giving a student/resident unknown medication.

I interviewed Roman Bounds Eisenhower Center-program coordinator on 7/30/21 and he stated he had implemented corrective action, i.e., the facility nurse changed Resident B's medication time so it does not conflict with the time to get on the bus for school, staff will carry identification, and medications will be in a labelled container, but not the actual medication pack, to address the school's concerns and to prevent future problems.

I conducted an exit conference with Devin Hutchins licensee designee and Stephanie Harris program coordinator on 7/30/21. They agreed with the conclusions and provided timely corrective action.

APPLICABLE RULE	
R 400.14312	Resident medications.
	(2) Medication shall be given, taken, or applied pursuant to label instructions.
ANALYSIS:	Although Resident B's medications were given within an hour of the time they are prescribed, they were still missed. Therefore, Resident B's medications were not given pursuant to label instructions.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

## IV. RECOMMENDATION

An acceptable plan of correction has been received; therefore, I recommend no changes in the status of the license.
