III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This facility was found to be in non-compliance with the following rules:

R 330.1803 Facility environment; fire safety.

(3) A facility that has a capacity of 4 or more clients shall conduct and document fire drills at least once during daytime, evening, and sleeping hours during every 3 month period.

Special certified home did not conduct drills once during the daytime, evening, and sleeping hours, every three months as required.

R 330.1803 Facility environment; fire safety.

(5) The capability of the clients to evacuate a facility in the event of a fire shall be assessed using methods described in appendix f of the 1985 life safety code of the national fire protection association. Appendix f of the 1985 life safety code of the national fire protection association is adopted by reference as part of these rules. A copy of the adopted appendix f is available from the Department of Mental Health, Lewis Cass Building, Lansing, MI 48913, at cost. A copy of appendix f may also be obtained from the National Fire Protection Association Library, Battermarch Park, P.O. Box 9101, Quincy, Massachusetts 02269-9101, 1-800-344-3555. A prepaid fee may be required by the national fire protection association for a copy of appendix f. Special Certification Evacuation difficulty index scores for residents were not completed.

R 400.1405

Health of a licensee, responsible person, and member of the household.

(3) A licensee shall provide the department with written evidence that he or she and each responsible person in the home is free from communicable tuberculosis. Verification shall be within the 3-year period before employment and verification shall occur every 3 years thereafter.

Licensee was unable to produce current TB test for staff and responsible person in the home.

R 400.1407

Resident admission and discharge criteria; resident assessment plan; resident care agreement; house guidelines; fee schedule; physicians instructions; health care appraisal.

(5) At the time of a resident's admission, a licensee shall complete a written resident care agreement which shall be established between the resident or the resident's designated representative, the responsible agency, and the licensee. A department form shall be used unless prior authorization for a substitute form has been granted in writing by the department. A resident shall be provided the care and services as stated in the written resident care agreement.

Resident care agreement for residents did not have the cost of care amount entered.

Resident care agreement for at least one resident was not signed by the licensee, the resident or the resident's designated representative.

R 400.1426 Main

Maintenance of premises.

(1) The premises shall be maintained in a clean and safe condition.

Water temperature in the kitchen and bathroom faucets tested at 135 degrees.

Closet in resident room #1 contained excessive clutter of clothes and other items on the floor.

R 400.1426

Maintenance of premises.

(4) Floors, interior walls, and ceilings shall be sound, in good repair, and maintained in a clean condition.

Hallway wall above resident room #2 has a crack in the foundation, starting at the ceiling.

Masking tape being used to cover worn carpeting for an even surface.

Ceiling fan in resident room #2 is detached and hanging from the ceiling.

R 400.1430 Bathrooms.

(2) Bathroom doors may be equipped with positive latching, non-locking-against-egress hardware. Hooks and eyes, bolts, bars, and other similar devices shall not be used on bathroom doors.

Bathroom locks were not equipped with positive latching, non-locking-against-egress hardware

R 400.1438 Emergency preparedness; evacuation plan; emergency transportation.

(4) Fire drills shall be conducted 4 times a year. Two of the 4 required fire drills shall be conducted during sleeping hours. A record of the fire drills shall be incorporated with the evacuation plan.

Licensee only conducted 2 fire drills.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, renewal of the license is recommended.
