## **III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS**

This facility was found to be in non-compliance with the following rules:

#### R 330.1803 Facility environment; fire safety.

(6) Evacuation assessments shall be conducted within 30 days after the admission of each new client and at least annually thereafter. The specialized program shall forward a copy of each completed assessment to the responsible agency and retain a copy in the home for inspection. A home that is assessed as having an evacuation difficulty index of "impractical" using appendix f of the life safety code of the national fire protection association shall have a period of 6 month from the date of the finding to either of the following:

(a) Improve the score to at least the "slow" category.

(b) Bring the home into compliance with the physical plant standards for "Impractical" homes contained in chapter 21 of the 1985 life safety code of the national fire protection association, which are adopted by reference in these rules and which may be obtained from the Department of Mental Health, Lewis Cass Building, Lansing, MI 48913, at cost, or from the National Fire Protection Association Library, Battermarch Park, P.O. Box 9101, Quincy, Massachusetts 02269-9101, 1-800-344-3555. A prepaid fee may be required by the national fire protection association for a copy of the chapter 21 standards. A price quote for copying of these pages may be obtained from the national fire protection association.

At the time of inspection, evacuation assessments (E-Scores) were not available for all residents within 30 days of admission.

#### R 400.14301 Resident admission criteria; resident assessment plan; emergency admission; resident care agreement; physician's instructions; health care appraisal.

(10) At the time of the resident's admission to the home, a licensee shall require that the resident or the resident's designated representative provide a written health care appraisal that is completed within the 90-day period before the resident's admission to the home. A written health care appraisal shall be completed at least annually. If a written

health care appraisal is not available at the time of an emergency admission, a licensee shall require that the appraisal be obtained not later than 30 days after admission. A department health care appraisal form shall be used unless prior authorization for a substitute form has been granted, in writing, by the department.

At the time of inspection, Resident A's resident file did not contain a health care appraisal at the time of admission. Resident B's resident file did not contain annual 2021 or 2022 health care appraisals.

#### R 400.14301 Resident admission criteria; resident assessment plan; emergency admission; resident care agreement; physician's instructions; health care appraisal.

(4) At the time of admission, and at least annually, a written assessment plan shall be completed with the resident or the resident's designated representative, the responsible agency, if applicable, and the licensee. A licensee shall maintain a copy of the resident's written assessment plan on file in the home.

At the time of inspection, Resident A's resident file did not contain a written assessment plan at the time of admission. Resident B's resident file did not contain annual 2021 or 2022 written assessment plan.

#### R 400.14301 Resident admission criteria; resident assessment plan; emergency admission; resident care agreement; physician's instructions; health care appraisal.

(9) A licensee shall review the written resident care agreement with the resident or the resident's designated representative and responsible agency, if applicable, at least annually or more often if necessary.

At the time of inspection, Resident B resident file did not contain an annual 2021 or 2022 resident care agreement.

#### R 400.14306 Use of assistive devices.

(3) Therapeutic supports shall be authorized, in writing, by a licensed physician. The authorization shall state the reason for the therapeutic support and the term of the authorization.

At the time of inspection, a shower chair was observed in the shower and toilet safety handrails were observed without authorization, in writing, by a licensed physician.

#### R 400.14315 Handling of resident funds and valuables.

(3) A licensee shall have a resident's funds and valuables transaction form completed and on file for each resident. A department form shall be used unless prior authorization for a substitute form has been granted, in writing, by the department.

At the time of inspection, Residents A and B resident files did not contain completed resident funds and valuables transaction forms. The forms were not available for review.

# R 400.14318 Emergency preparedness; evacuation plan; emergency transportation.

(5) A licensee shall practice emergency and evacuation procedures during daytime, evening, and sleeping hours at least once per quarter. A record of the practices shall be maintained and be available for department review.

At the time of inspection, emergency and evacuation procedures were not completed during daytime, evening, and sleeping hours at least once per quarter.

Evening drills were not conducted in 2021 or 2022 the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter. Evening drills were not conducted in 2022 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. Evening drills were not conducted in 2021 or 2022 the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. Evening drills were not conducted in 2021 or 2022 the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.

## R 400.14401 Environmental health.

(2) Hot and cold running water that is under pressure shall be provided. A licensee shall maintain the hot water temperature for a resident's use at a range of 105 degrees Fahrenheit to 120 degrees Fahrenheit at the faucet.

At the time of inspection, the hot water in did not range between 105 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit at the faucet.

- Kitchen, 132 degrees
- Bathroom in resident room, 126 degrees

#### R 400.14401 Environmental health.

(5) An insect, rodent, or pest control program shall be maintained as necessary and shall be carried out in a manner that continually protects the health of residents.

At the time of inspection, Rodent droppings were observed in the kitchen cabinets. Proof of a pest control program was provided or available for review.

The staff stated mice traps were put in place, but the mice move and/or manipulate the traps.

#### R 400.14403 Maintenance of premises.

(1) A home shall be constructed, arranged, and maintained to provide adequately for the health, safety, and well-being of occupants.

At the time of inspection, the home was not constructed, arranged, and maintained to provide adequately for the health, safety, and well-being of occupants.

• Pantry door in the kitchen was leaning and not properly side hinged.

• Air-filter attachment in the in the living is broken and has a jagged edge.

• The lower wall in Resident F's bedroom was covered with a plastic runner and was unfinished.

#### R 400.14403 Maintenance of premises.

(2) Home furnishings and housekeeping standards shall present a comfortable, clean, and orderly appearance.

At the time of inspection, the housekeeping standards did not present a comfortable, clean, and orderly appearance.

• Resident E's bedroom was dusty and there was an abundance of cobwebs observed on the walls and ceiling.

• The lower walls in Resident F's bedroom contained a brown substance and was not clean.

#### R 400.14407 Bathrooms.

(1) Bathrooms and toilet facilities that do not have windows shall have forced ventilation to the outside. Bathroom windows that are used for ventilation shall open easily.

At the time of inspection, the mechanical vent in the bathroom located in the resident's bedroom was not in working condition. **R 400.14408** Bedrooms generally.

(7) Bedrooms shall have at least 1 easily openable window.

At the time of inspection, Resident C's bedroom window was not openable.

#### IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, renewal of the license is recommended.
