ALLEGATION:

Employees at the home disposed of residents' mail and restrict their movement.

INVESTIGATION:

On 9/15/25, I interviewed employee Chindarat Runteranoont (Mimi) in the home. Mimi denied withholding mail from residents. Mimi showed me where the mail is kept, in a receptacle near the dining room. She advised that she passes out the mail, unopened, to respective residents.

I interviewed Resident A, who stated that he receives his mail unopened, and was unaware of any issue where several letters were disposed of in a nearby dumpster. I interviewed Resident B, who shared that she was a former postal worker. She denied having any knowledge of the home disposing resident mail in a nearby dumpster.

I interviewed Resident C, who also denied that the home does not give residents their mail.

I interviewed Resident D, who also denied having his mail withheld. He commented that he sometimes visits a nearby bar, where he socializes.

The residents denied that they are prohibited from leaving the home.

Mimi advised that there was a resident who left the home and had to be escorted by police back to the home from a nearby bank parking lot. She advised that this resident does not have community access per the resident's assessment plan, due to a mental condition.

On 9/28/23, I reviewed a Morenci Police Department report. The report reflected similar discussions with police regarding the home's mail procedure to the statement provided to me by residents and staff members.
