### **ALLEGATION:**

**Resident A was injured by an employee's child.**

### **INVESTIGATION:**

On 2/16/24, I interviewed the source by telephone. The source clarified that Resident A was being threatened by an adult child of an employee.

On 2/20/24, I interviewed Employee #2 in the home. Employee #2 stated that Resident A was involved in some "rough playing" with a minor child of another employee. He stated that Resident A tended to instigate the rough play. He stated that when he worked the floor, if he observed any such interaction, he would immediately redirect Resident A away from the children. Employee #2 advised that Resident A sustained an injury during one of these encounters and that licensee designee Vicky Cates had been notified. He stated that as a result the children no longer come to the home.

I interviewed Resident A in the home. Resident A stated that he did engage in rough play with an employee's minor child, who he estimated to be about 12 years old. He stated that he sustained a bruise around the right side of his torso as a result. He mentioned that the child's brother, who is about 18, told him that if he interfered with his brother, he would retaliate against Resident A. Resident A also stated that there were times when he was in his room, trying to rest, and the child would enter the room to engage in play or invade his privacy.

I interviewed Resident B in the home. Resident B reported that he and Resident A share a room. He denied seeing a child enter the room while he was there, nor did he observe a child invade Resident A's privacy while in the room.

On 3/8/24, I interviewed Employee #1 in the home. Employee #1 stated that as far as she was aware, there were two instances where her son and Resident A engaged in rough play. On one occasion, she was not at the home but the children got off the bus and her niece was supposed to be monitoring the child. On another occasion she was working and once she became aware that they were engaged in rough play, she took steps to separate them and kept her son close to her person.

<b>APPLICABLE RULE</b>	
<b>R 400.14305</b>	<b>Resident protection.</b>
	<b>(3) A resident shall be treated with dignity and his or her personal needs, including protection and safety, shall be attended to at all times in accordance with the provisions of the act.</b>
<b>ANALYSIS:</b>	Based on interviews conducted with residents and employees, it would appear that Resident A was allowed to engage in rough play with a child, resulting in him sustaining an injury. Therefore, a violation was established that the home did not effectively provide for his safety, since the child in question may not have been properly supervised.
<b>CONCLUSION:</b>	<b>VIOLATION ESTABLISHED</b>

On 3/8/24, I conducted an exit conference with licensee designee Vicky Cates. I advised Ms. Cates of my findings. Ms. Cates reported that she had fixed the problem by barring the children from going to the home and would furnish a corrective action plan to that effect.

**IV. RECOMMENDATION**

I recommend no change to the status of this license.




