III. METHODOLOGY

ALLEGATION:

- **Covid 19 spread through the home due to lack of preventive measures.**
- **Residents are exhibiting many bruises and wounds.**

INVESTIGATION:

On 1/25/24, I interviewed licensee Kim Lich. Ms. Lich stated that both she and her father contracted Covid-19 in December 2023, and that her father was hospitalized with pneumonia on 1/2/24. Ms. Lich stated that she took precautions such as wearing a mask, and advised her residents' relatives that visits should be suspended upon testing negative. Ms. Lich offered that she was immunized and expressed that she was mindful of the risk that spreading the virus can cause. She reported that at this time no one in the home has the virus.

During the inspection, I observed a mask near her office area. I also observed 1/22/24 visit notes from a Dr. Dawde, from the Ann Arbor Harmony/Cares Medical Group.

Ms. Lich denied that there were any residents with suspicious bruising. She stated that as residents grew older, there is a tendency for the skin to be thinner, resulting in bruising. She acknowledged being aware that if a resident developed a pressure sore, that regular repositioning would slow the progress of the wound becoming deeper or infected.

I interviewed Resident A in the home. Resident A denied being Covid positive, and denied having any bruising on her body that went unaddressed. I did not observe any bruises around the areas of her body that were visible.

On 2/14/24, I interviewed Relative A1 by telephone. Relative A1 stated that he was made aware that a resident in the home was positive for Covid-19 in late December 2023. He stated that he was unable to visit his relative as a precaution. Relative A1 offered that he is satisfied with the care that Resident A receives in the home.

APPLICABLE RULE	
R 400.1416	Resident healthcare.
	(1) A licensee, in conjunction with a resident's cooperation, shall follow the instructions and recommendations of a resident's physician regarding medications, special diets, and other resident healthcare needs that can be provided in the home.
ANALYSIS:	During my onsite inspection, a resident that I observed did not appear to have any suspicious bruising. There were no concerns expressed about bruising on a doctor's visit note that I observed. Ms. Lich reported that she did take precautions such as wearing masks, and informed family members that the home had Covid positive people. A relative confirmed that he was informed of the home's Covid positive status. Based on this information there is insufficient evidence to establish any of the aforementioned rule violations.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION NOT ESTABLISHED

On 2/14/24, I conducted an exit conference with licensee Kim Lich. I shared my findings and Ms. Lich agreed with the conclusions reached.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend no change to the status of this license.


