ALLEGATION: On July 25, 2024, a water sample was taken by the Health Department and tested positive for coliform bacteria.

INVESTIGATION:

On August 23, 2024, an Environmental Health Inspection Report (EHI) from Mid-Michigan District Health Department was received by this department documenting that on July 25, 2024, a water sample was taken from the facility and tested positive for coliform bacteria.

On August 23, 2024, I interviewed licensee designee Timothy Brannan who reported the system has already been chlorinated and a water sample sent to Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) for retesting. Mr. Brannan reported the facility was using bottled water for drinking and cooking until the water sample test was received on August 18, 2024, with negative coliform bacteria.

On August 26, 2024, this department requested Environmental Health Inspection from the Mid-Michigan Health Department to resample of the facility water supply.

On August 29, 2024, I completed an onsite investigation and interviewed licensee designee Timothy Brannan who provided copies of EGLE water test completed on August 08, 2024. This documentation verified that the water system was negative for coliform bacteria and included a receipt from Schwarnweber Well Drilling documenting chlorination treatment, and corrective action plan. Mr. Brannan stated the facility used bottled water for cooking and drinking until the facility water supply was retested and ultimately negative for coliform bacteria. Mr. Brannan stated the facility continues to use bottled water for drinking until the EHI report and testing has been completed verifying there is no coliform bacteria in system.

APPLICABLE RULE	
R 400.14401	Environmental health.
	(1) Private water systems shall be in compliance with R 325.10101 et seq. of the Michigan Administrative Code. A bacteriological report confirming water quality shall be required during the initial inspection and every 2 years thereafter. Group homes that use a community-approved water system need not be in compliance with this requirement.
ANALYSIS:	On August 23, 2024, an Environmental Health Inspection Report (EHI) from Mid-Michigan District Health Department was received by this department documenting that on July 25, 2024, a water sample was taken and tested positive for coliform bacteria making the facility not in compliance with environmental health rules as required.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

IV. RECOMMENDATION

An acceptable corrective action plan has been received and it is recommended that the current status of the license remains unchanged.
