The purpose of the addendum is to add wheelchair accessibility to the license.

III. Methodology

IV. Description of Findings and Conclusions

On 08/15/24, during the renewal inspection, licensee designee, Krishelle Wiley, submitted a written modification requesting to add wheelchair accessibility to the license. I informed Ms. Wiley that although the two approved means of egress did not require ramps, that some type of wedge would be needed at both exits to ensure a smooth transition for wheelchairs to enter and exit. Ms. Wiley reported that she would purchase the required wedges and contact me once she had.

I also completed a walkthrough of the home and confirmed that the hallways and resident room doors were wide enough to accommodate wheelchairs and found that they were.

On 10/25/24, I conducted an on-site inspection and observed the wedges placed at the two approved means of egress. Ms. Wiley did not have them drilled into the ground at that time, as she wanted my approval prior to doing so. I approved the wedges as they would provide residents who require the regular use of a wheelchair with a smooth transition entering and exiting the home.

On 11/15/24, Ms. Wiley sent pictures showing that the wedges had been drilled into the ground and were not moveable.

V. Recommendation

I recommend that wheelchair accessibility be added to the license granting Island House the ability to admit residents who require the regular use of a wheelchair.
