Violation Established? Resident medications are not being administered as prescribed. No Resident medications are not documented properly or consistently on the resident medication administration records (MARs). Yes

III. METHODOLOGY

ALLEGATION: Resident medications are not being administered as prescribed and resident medications are not documented properly or consistently on the resident medication administration records (MARs).

INVESTIGATION: On 05/30/2024, I received an emailed complaint reporting that Reliance Community Care Partners recently conducted an unannounced review at

this facility of resident medications for four participants that reside in this facility. The complainant reported there appeared to be missed doses of medications and/or errors in the recording of medications over the last month and a half.

On 05/30/2024, I interviewed Vicki Holmes, Reliance Community Care Partners, Contract Coordinator via telephone. Ms. Holmes stated they contract with Ms. Sanders for the care of four residents in this facility and during a recent review of the resident medications, they discovered documentation of the administration of resident medications was not complete on all four of the residents that participate in Reliance Community Care Partners program.

On 06/06/2024, I reviewed MARs (medication administration records) for Residents A, B, C, and D for the months of May, and June (to date, June 05) 2024. The MARs documented the following:

Resident A's medications:

- Alendronate Tab 35MG, take 1 tab by mouth weekly (do not lie down/eat/drink/take other meds for 30 minutes), documented as administered as prescribed in May and June, to date.
- Benztropine tab 1MG, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00p.m. not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 1 time in June to date.
- Carb/Levo Tab 25-100MG, take two tablets by mouth three times daily, 8:00a.m., 1:00p.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 42 times in May 2024 and 1x in June 2024.
- Culturelle CHW Digestive, chew one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 but administered as prescribed each day to date in June 2024.
- Gabapentin Cap 100MG, take one capsule by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., the medication was discontinued on 05/03/2024 but not documented as administered on 05/01/2024, 8:00a.m.
- Lamotrigine Tab 100MG, take two tablets by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 1x to date in June 2024.
- Lamotrigine Tab 200MG, take ½ tablet (100MG) by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 9 times in May 2024 and documented as administered to date in June 2024.
- Levetiraceta Tab 750MG, take one tablet by mouth every twelve hours, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 8 times for the 8:00a.m. medication and 21 times for the 8:00p.m. medication and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Lisinopril Tab 10MG, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 29 times in May 2024 and 1 time in June 2024, to date.

- Melatonin Tab 3MG, take two tablets (6MG) by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Omeprazole CAP 20MG, take one capsule by mouth twice daily, not documented as administered 29 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Polyeth GLYC POW 3350 NF, mix 17 grams with 8 ounces of water or liquid and drink once daily, not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and 2 times to date in June 2024.
- Quetiapine Tab 100MG, take one tablet by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed each day, to date in June 2024.
- Quetiapine Tab 100MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Risperidone Tab 2MG, take one tablet by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed each date, to date in June 2024.

- Ear drops, DRO 06.5%, instill 5 drops into affected ear(s) twice daily, not documented as administered 34 times in May 2024 and 6 times to date in June 2024.

- Eliquis tab 5mg, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 33 times in May 2024 and 6 times to date in June 2024.
- Ferosul tab 325MG, take one tablet by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 13 times in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Fluticasone SPR 50MCG, use one spray in each nostril twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 35 times in May 2024 and 6 times to date in June 2024.
- Furosemide tab 40mg, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 12:00p.m., not documented as administered 25 times in May 2024 and 6 times to date in June 2024.
- Lantus Solos INJ 100/ML, inject 25 units subcutaneously twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8: 00p.m, not documented as administered 33 times in May 2024 and 6 times to date in June 2024.
- Loratadine Tab 10MG, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 9 times in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Mag Oxide Tab 400MG, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 10 times in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Melatonin Tab 3MG, take three tablets (9mg) by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 24 times in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Metoprol Suc Tab 25MG ER, take 1 tablet oral every day, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 9 times in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Microlet Mis Lancets, use as directed three times daily, 8:00a.m., 1:00p.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 51 times in May 2024 and 9 times to date in June 2024.

- NYAMYC POW 100000, apply 1 gram topically twice daily *under breasts and abdominal folds, * 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 34 times in May 2024 and 6 times to date in June 2024.

- Olanzapine tab 2.5 MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 2 times to date in June 2024.
- Omeprazole Tab 20MG DR, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Prednisone Tab 5MG, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Senna-S Tab 8.6-50MG, take two tablets by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Senna-Time Tab 8.6MG, take two tablets by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024, and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Simvastatin Tab 20MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024, and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Trazodone Tab 50MG, take ½ tablet (2.5 MG) by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Vitamin D3 Tab 25 MCG, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 8 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.

Resident D's medications:

• Acetaminophen Tab 650MG, take one tablet by mouth three times daily, 8:00a.m., 1:00p.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 41 times in

May 2024 and 1x to date in June 2024.

- Aquaphor-ointment, apply 1 gram once daily to feet and toenails, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 11 times in May 2024 and 2 times to date in June 2024.
- Aripiprazole Tab 15mg, take one tablet by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m., DC' d on 05/16/2024, not documented as administered 6 times from 05/01/2024-05/15/2024 and documented administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Aripiprazole Tab 15mg, take one tablet by mouth every morning, prescription written 05/15/2024 was not documented as administered 1 time from 05/16/2024-05/31/2024.
- Aspirin low chew 81mg, chew one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 7 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Carvedilol Tab 12.5mg, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 28 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Diclofenac Gel 1%, apply 2.25 inches to bilateral legs twice daily, 8:00a.m.,8:00p.m., not documented as administered 32 times in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Divalproex Tab 250mg DR, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, not documented as administered 28 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Ferosul Tab 325 mg, take one tablet by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 7 times in May 2024 and administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Furosemide Tab 40mg. take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 28 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.

- Pantoprazole tab 40mg, take one tablet by mouth once daily, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 7 times in May 2024 and documented administered as prescribed to date in June 2024.
- Pravastatin Tab 40mg, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 21 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.
- Prednisolone sus 1% OP, instill one drop in the left eye once daily for 7 days, 8:00a.m., written 03/04/2024 and DC' d on 05/07/2024, not documented as administered 05/01/2024, 05/04/2024 & 05/05/202.
- Pulmicort INH 90MCG, inhale one puff by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 32 time in May 2024 and 3 times to date in June 2024.
- Senna-S tab 8.6-50mg, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 29 times in May 2024 and 1 time to date in June 2024.

On 06/11/2024, I conducted an unannounced inspection at the facility and interviewed DCW (direct care worker) Kris Taylor. Ms. Taylor stated she works at the facility 1:00p.m.-7:00p.m. and stated she administers resident medications as prescribed but she does not mark the administration of the medications on the MAR because the licensee designee, Christina Sanders prefers to document the MAR. Ms. Taylor stated she has been trained in medication administration and demonstrated to me how she double checks resident medications she is placing in a small cup, how she passes one resident's medications in a cup at a time before moving on to the next resident. Ms. Taylor stated she is knowledgeable about the "5 R's of medication passing" and stated they are, Right Patient, Right Drug, Right Dose, Right Route, Right Time but stated she is not aware if any of the other staff that work at the facility do it that way.

On 06/11/2024, I attempted to interview residents at the facility and the residents present at the facility were not able to provide information pertinent to this investigation due to cognitive deficits.

On 06/11/2024, I reviewed the MARs for Residents E & F on the computerized MAR at the facility for the month of June 2024 to date (06/11/2024). The MARs documented the following:

Resident E's medications:

- Acetaminophen Tab 650 MG, 1 tab by mouth every 6 hours, 12:00a.m., 6:00a.m., 12:00p.m., 6:00p.m., not documented as administered 5 times to date (06/11/2024).
- Aquaphor Ointment, apply 1 gram 1 time daily to feet and toenails, 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 3 times to date.

- Carvedilol tab 25 mg, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 5 times to date.
- Ferrous Gluc Tab 324MG, take one tablet by mouth three times daily, 8:00a.m., 1:00p.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 6 times to date.
- Hydralazine Tab 25MG, take one tablet by mouth three times daily with 50 MG tablet, 8:00a.m., 1:00p.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 6 times to date.
- Lisinopril Tab 20MG, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 4 times to date.
- Meloxicam Tab 15MG, take one tablet by mouth every morning, 8:00a.m. is signed by Ms. Sanders each day to date.
- Olanzapine Tab 15MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime *take in addition to 2.5 MG tab twice daily, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 4 times to date.
- Olanzapine Tab 205MG, take one tablet by mouth twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 4 times to date.
- Quetiapine Tab 50MG, take two tablets (100MG) by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 4 times to date.
- Trazodone Tab 100MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 4 times to date.

Resident F's medications:

- Atorvastatin Tab 40MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 5 times to date.
- Benztropine Tab 1MG, take one tablet by mouth twice daily *morning and 4:00p.m., 8:00a.m. & 4:00p.m., not documented as administered 3 times to date.
- Clobetasol Sol 0.05%, apply 1ML to scalp twice daily *do not rinse off, * 8:00a.m., 8: 00p.m, not documented as administered 8 times to date.
- Contour Test Next, use to check blood sugar twice daily, not documented as administered 8 times to date.
- Contour Next Kit Gen, use to check blood sugar twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 8 times to date.
- Easy Touch Mis Lanc/30MG, use as directed to check blood sugar twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 8 times to date.
- Freestyle Libre 2 sensor, apply new sensor to skin every 14 days, no signatures that sensor applied to date, however, there still could have been one on in the past 14 days.
- Prazosin HCL Cap 1MG, take one capsule by mouth at bedtime, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 5 times to date.
- Quetiapine Tab 300MG, take one tablet by mouth at bedtime **off cycle**, 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 5 times to date.
- Selsun Blue SHA 1%, apply to scalp once daily *Let sit for 5 minutes, then rinse* 8:00a.m., not documented as administered 3 times to date.
- Triamcinolone OIN apply thin layer to scalp twice daily, 8:00a.m., 8:00p.m., not documented as administered 8 times to date.

On 07/09/2024, I interviewed Christina Sanders, Licensee Designee, via telephone. Ms. Sanders stated if staff administer resident medications, that staff person signs the MAR as administering the medication. Ms. Sanders stated she would never instruct staff administering medications to not sign the MAR so she could sign it as reported by Ms. Taylor. Ms. Sanders stated she is the "guilty party" and the unsigned spots on the MAR "might be" all her doing and that she gets "lazy" and does not always sign the MAR after administering resident medications. Ms. Sanders stated the resident medications are being administered but acknowledged that she does not always sign the MAR. In addition, Ms. Sanders stated it "might be" other staff who are doing the same and not signing the MAR but she knows she has personally failed to sign the MAR after administering resident medications. Ms. Sanders stated that resident medications are administering resident medications. Ms. Sanders stated at resident medications are administering resident medications. Ms. Sanders stated it might be approximately failed to sign the MAR after administering resident medications. Ms. Sanders stated that resident medications are administering resident medications. Ms. Sanders stated that resident medications are administered but acknowledged that sometimes they are not signed for at the time of administration.

On 07/09/2024, I interviewed Michelle Guillen, DCW via telephone. Ms. Guillen stated she is a direct care worker but also oversees the medications for the facility. Ms. Guillen stated staff "absolutely" do not leave the MAR blank for Ms. Sanders to sign at a later time. Ms. Guillen stated staff know that upon administering resident medications, they are to sign the MAR. Ms. Guillen stated there was an oversight in getting Ms. Taylor a login for the MAR system. She did not know that Mr. Taylor did not have a login for the system and that is why she was not able to sign the MAR. Ms. Guillen stated on 06/11/2024 after my inspection at the facility, she was made aware that Ms. Taylor did not have a login for the medications she administers. Ms. Guillen stated it was an oversight that was remedied on 06/11/2024. Ms. Guillen stated staff are trained in medication administration through Guardian pharmacy nurse, Sarah (Westerbrink). Ms. Guillen stated residents at the facility always receive their medications.

On 07/15/2024, I interviewed Sarah Westerbrink, RN with Guardian pharmacy via telephone. Ms. Westerbrink stated she has provided training to staff onsite, at the facility, and at no time were staff ever instructed to allow others to sign the MAR for them or to leave the MAR blank upon administration of resident medications. Ms. Westerbrink stated ongoing training opportunities are provided online every four weeks and staff can take the training on a regular basis if they need a refresher in medication administration including the documentation of medications.

On 07/16/2024, I conducted an exit conference with Licensee Designee & Administrator, Christina Sanders via telephone. Ms. Sanders again acknowledged that she was not documenting resident medications on the MAR that were administered, she stated corrections have been made, all resident medications given will be documented on the MAR and this will not occur in the future. Ms. Sanders stated the resident medications are being administered as prescribed and she and staff will continue to make sure all resident medications are handled per licensing rules. Ms. Sanders stated she understands the information, analysis, and conclusion of this applicable rule.

APPLICABLE RULE		
R 400.14312	Resident medications.	
	(1) Prescription medication, including dietary supplements, or individual special medical procedures shall be given, taken, or applied only as prescribed by a licensed physician or dentist. Prescription medication shall be kept in the original pharmacy-supplied container, which shall be labeled for the specified resident in accordance with the requirements of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, as amended, being S333.1101 et seq. of the Michigan Compiled Laws, kept with the equipment to administer it in a locked cabinet or drawer, and refrigerated if required.	
ANALYSIS:	Upon a review of Resident A, B, C, D, E and F's medication administration records, it appeared that resident medication is not being given, taken, or applied as prescribed by the physician. However, Ms. Taylor, Ms. Sanders, and Ms. Guillen each reported resident medications are administered as prescribed, and it is the documentation that is in error. There is not a preponderance of evidence to indicate that staff are not administering resident medications and therefore, a violation of this applicable rule is not established.	
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION NOT ESTABLISHED

	 (4) When a licensee, administrator, or direct care staff member supervises the taking of medication by a resident, he or she shall comply with all the following provisions: (v) The initials of the person who administers the medication, which shall be entered at the time the medication is given. 	
ANALYSIS:	Resident A, B, C, D, E and F's medication administration records show numerous dates and occasions when staff failed to document that they had administered resident medications as prescribed. Therefore, a violation of this applicable rule is established.	
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED	

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan that includes verification of additional medication training, I recommend the status of the license remain unchanged.
