III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This facility was found to be in non-compliance with the following rules:

R 325.1932 Resident medications.

(2) Prescribed medication managed by the home shall be given, taken, or applied pursuant to labeling instructions, orders and by the prescribing licensed health care professional.

A review of the narcotic count logs for the 1400 and 1500 hall medication carts revealed several instances where staff did not sign off to confirm that a narcotic count had been completed. Specifically, the narcotic count log for the 1400 hallway was left blank for one or more shifts on the following dates: 3/19/2025, 3/22/2025, and 3/24/2025. Similarly, the narcotic count log for the 1500 hallway was left blank for one or more shifts on the following dates: 3/8/2025, 3/10/2025, 3/18/2025, and 3/23/2025.

Additionally, a review of the medication administration records (MARs) for February and March 2025 revealed that medications were not always administered as prescribed by the licensed healthcare professional. For example, Resident A's insulin orders were not consistently followed as prescribed:

Humalog, inject 11 units subcutaneously once daily in the morning with breakfast (hold if blood glucose is less than 150): Staff documented the administration of Humalog when the blood glucose was less than 150 on the following dates: 2/1/2025, 2/5/2025 through 2/7/2025, 2/10/2025, 2/11/2025, 2/15/2025 through 2/17/2025, 2/20/2025 through 2/23/2025, 2/25/2025, 2/26/2025, 3/2/2025 through 3/5/2025, 3/7/2025 through 3/9/2025, 3/11/2025, 3/13/2025 through 3/18/2025, 3/20/2025, 3/21/2025, 3/24/2025, and 3/25/2025.

Humalog, inject subcutaneously three times daily per sliding scale: Staff documented Humalog administration not in accordance with the sliding scale on one or more doses on the following dates: 2/3/2025 through 2/8/2025, 2/18/2025, 2/22/2025, 2/23/2025, 2/26/2025 through 2/28/2025, 3/1/2025 through 3/4/2025, 3/6/2025, 3/8/2025, 3/9/2025, 3/12/2025, 3/14/2025, 3/15/2025, 3/18/2025 through 3/20/2025, and 3/23/2025.

Humalog, inject 8 units subcutaneously once daily with lunch (hold if blood glucose is less than 150): Staff documented the administration of Humalog when the blood glucose was less than 150 on the following dates: 2/4/2025, 2/7/2025, 2/21/2025, 2/24/2025, 2/28/2025, 3/9/2025, 3/13/2025, and 3/14/2025.

Humalog, inject 7 units subcutaneously once daily with dinner (hold if blood glucose is less than 150): Staff documented the administration of Humalog when the blood glucose was less than 150 on the following dates: 3/4/2025, 3/9/2025, 3/14/2025, and 3/23/2025.

Lantus, inject 15 units subcutaneously daily at bedtime (hold if blood glucose is less than 150): Staff documented the administration of Lantus when the blood glucose was less than 150 on the following date: 3/18/2025. Additionally, the blood glucose, blood glucose site, and witness for 3/9/2025 were left blank, making it unclear whether it was administered.

Moreover, Resident E was prescribed Torsemide (1 tablet by mouth every other day, on even days in February and March, and withheld if standing weight is less than 155 pounds). On 2/1/2025, Resident E's weight was recorded as 154.7 pounds, yet staff documented the medication as administered on 2/2/2025, and on all other even days in February 2025, except for 2/16/2025. It is unclear whether staff were instructed to weigh Resident E once a month or on the days the medication was due to be administered.

VIOLATION ESTABLISHED.

R 325.1976 Kitchen and dietary.

(13) A multi-use utensil used in food storage, preparation, transport, or serving shall be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized after each use and shall be handled and stored in a manner which will protect it from contamination.

A review of the three-compartment sink log for January and February 2025 revealed that staff were required to test the wash temperature, third sink temperature, and sanitation sink three times daily. However, there were instances where one or more tests were not completed on the following dates: 1/29/2025, 2/16/2025, 2/17/2025, and 2/20/2025. As a result, it could not be confirmed whether proper and adequate sanitization of dishware was completed.

VIOLATION ESTABLISHED.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Contingent upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, renewal of the license is recommended.
