II. METHODOLOGY

ALLEGATION: The facility stopped Resident A’s medications without a physician order.

INVESTIGATION:

On 08/19/2025, the complaint was submitted to the Bureau of Community and Health Systems. The APS referral source alleged the facility stopped Resident A’s medications Aspirin, Nitroglycerin, ear drops and Retinol A, without a physician’s order. Other allegations within this intake were previously investigated during the Special Investigation conducted in April 2025.

On 09/05/2025, I interviewed Jenifer Stanley, Executive Director who reported that Resident A was admitted to the HFA on October 3, 2024, and has often exhibited problematic behavioral. The Executive Director described her behavior as refusing offsite appointments with physicians as well as repeatedly calling their offices to the point that the offices asked the facility to limit Resident A’s reaching out to them. The Executive Director reported that Resident A was a retired physician and is prone to inserting herself into her medication regimen. The Executive Director described other behaviors that included verbal outbursts while in the waiting rooms at

physician appointments, frequently swearing at staff, frequently refusing medications and refusing to let staff in her room to be able to clean and change bed linens.

On 09/05/2025, I reviewed the MAR documentation and noted that Aspirin 81mg one tablet daily has a start order date of 08/11/2025. Resident A had never been on Aspirin before that time. Nitroglycerin 0.4mg as needed, has a start order of 08/20/25. Resident A has not had this medication ordered since her arrival at the facility. Earwax removal drops 6.5% solution, 5 drops in both ears twice daily for 14 days, was ordered on 4/28/25, 8/11/25 and again on 9/04/25. This medication had a defined end date of 14 days. Retinol A is not ordered for Resident A. The Executive Director reports that Resident A has vacillated between asking for Retinol A and not wanting medication. The Executive Director reports that Resident A's primary care physician has ordered instead Ammonium Lactate Lotion 12% to be applied topically at bedtime daily.

On 9/05/2025, I interviewed Resident A who was alert and oriented, well dressed and eager to converse about her difficulties with the facility. Resident A reported that she has had encephalopathy in the past but added that the hospital she was at had accused her of abusing drugs to which she stated, "I have never been a drug abuser." She went on to relay concerns that her house was being sold by her daughter (DPOA) and she was going to court to get a different DPOA assigned. Resident A spoke without prompting that the facility had stopped her medications without an order and when I informed Resident A that I had looked at that and did not see any evidence of the facility withholding medications, she did not argue the point any further.

ANALYSIS:	Through record review and interviews conducted, there was no evidence that any of Resident A's medication had been withheld without a physician's order.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION NOT ESTABLISHED

III. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend no change in the status of the license.
