II. METHODOLOGY

ALLEGATION: Staff sleep during the night shift and are not engaging meaningfully with residents.

INVESTIGATION:

On 10/22/2025, I interviewed the interim Executive Director Staci Tripolsky. The Executive Director reported being new to this position and that the former Executive Director and Wellness Director had both left the facility at the end of September. The Executive Director reported that she had conducted an open meeting with residents' families to hear concerns about the care their family members were receiving at the facility. The Executive Director reported that for the families that did not attend the open meeting emails were sent out soliciting their feedback. The Executive Director reported not receiving any reports of staff sleeping on the night shift or staff not interacting respectfully with residents.

On 10/22/2025, I toured the facility with the Executive Director. Residents in the common areas were observed to be clean and well dressed. I interviewed Resident A who reported receiving good care, prompt responses to her calls for assistance at night and had no complaints about the facility to offer. I interviewed Resident B and her daughter. Resident B reported receiving good care and prompt responses to calls for assistance on day shift and night shift. Resident B's daughter reported being satisfied with her mother's care. Resident B's daughter denied any knowledge of staff not being responsive to her mother's needs during the night shift. I interviewed Resident C's daughter as Resident C had a speech deficit. Resident C's daughter reported that her mother's care was satisfactory. I interviewed Resident D who reported receiving good care and stated that this was the 4th facility he has lived at

and thought this Assisted Living Facility the best one he has experienced. I interviewed Resident E and his wife who was visiting him on the memory care unit. Resident E reported being satisfied with the care he currently receives. Resident E's wife reported being generally happy with the services.

On 10/22/2025 I reviewed training records for Staff Persons 1 and Staff Person 2 (SP1 & SP2 respectively), both caregivers working on the midnight shift. Neither staff has had any disciplinary actions. SP1's date of hire was 02/22/2025 and has completed 40 courses relevant to caring for residents of the facility. SP2's date of hire was 09/03/2025 and has completed 8 courses relevant to caring for residents of the facility. An example of the relevant care courses included subjects such as: Management of Advanced Dementia in Hospice, Supporting Seniors with Pain and Anxiety, Infection Control Concepts, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation. The Executive Director reports that the courses are online and staff complete them at their own pace.

ANALYSIS:	Based on Resident interviews, family interviews, and training records there is no evidence to support that residents are receiving inadequate care on the night shift.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION NOT ESTABLISHED

III. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend no change to the status of the license.
