### III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This facility was found to be in non-compliance with the following rules:

<b>MCL 400.734b</b>	<b>Employing or contracting with certain individuals providing direct services to residents; prohibitions; criminal history check; exemptions; written consent and identification; conditional employment; use of criminal history record information; disclosure; determination of existence of national criminal history; failure to conduct criminal history check; automated fingerprint identification system database; electronic web-based system; costs; definitions.</b>
	<b>(10) An adult foster care facility or staffing agency shall use criminal history record information obtained under subsection (3), (4), or (5) only for the purpose of evaluating an individual's qualifications for employment in the position for which he or she has applied and for the purposes of subsections (6) and (8). An adult foster care facility or staffing agency or an employee of the adult foster care facility or staffing agency shall not disclose criminal history record information obtained under this section to a person who is not directly involved in evaluating the individual's qualifications for employment or independent contract. An individual who knowingly uses or disseminates the criminal history record information obtained under subsection (3), (4), or (5) in violation of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both. Except for a knowing or intentional release of false information, an adult foster care facility or staffing agency has no liability in connection with a criminal history check conducted in compliance with this section or the release of criminal history record information under this subsection.</b>

<p>As of 03/13/2026, the workforce background check system indicates that the Beacon Home at Chesterfield has 97 employees. On 03/11/2026, The Home Manager reported that the home currently has six employees. Licensee was notified on 02/17/2026 and 03/10/2026 regarding number of employees in system for Beacon Home at Chesterfield. Active employees that no longer work at home in workforce background check system could result in the licensee receiving rap backs and criminal history for individuals they no longer employ and should not receive information.</p>

<p>Resident B's March 2026 medication log and pharmacy label instructions for Divalproex did not match. Pharmacy label for Resident B's Divalproex Tab 250 mg indicated to take 1 tablet by mouth twice daily. Resident B's medication log listed Depakote 250 mg, take one tablet by mouth everyday at bedtime at 8:00 pm.</p>
