

ALLEGATION:

Resident A left the facility unsupervised.

INVESTIGATION:

On 03/12/2026, I received a complaint via LARA-BCHS-Complaints. This complaint was opened by Adult Protective Services (APS) for investigation.

On 03/17/2026, I interviewed APS Investigator, Rebecca Robelin. Investigator Robelin stated that it is her understanding that Resident A eloped from the facility and was returned by the police. Resident A is placed through A & D Waiver, who is seeking an alternative placement, due to his continuing elopement attempts. Investigator Robelin stated that she will be substantiating the allegations of neglect due to resident A eloping from the facility.

On 03/20/2026, I conducted an unannounced onsite inspection at Close to Home Assisted Living Side 2. Contact was made with the Manager, Jennifer Ireland. Manager Ireland stated that Resident A is physically fit and walks pretty fast. Home Manager, Jennifer Ireland confirmed that Resident A eloped and was returned to the facility by the police. Resident A was not assaulted, nor did he require any medical attention. The facility was not aware that Resident A is an elopement risk. As a result, a 30-day discharge notice has been given. A & D Waiver Program is seeking a new placement. Manager Ireland confirmed that Resident A was returned to the facility by the police.

On 03/20/2026, while onsite I attempted to interview Resident A. Resident A mumbled a lot and was not coherent during the conversation. No interview was able to be obtained. Resident A was observed while sitting outside in the center courtyard of the facility. Resident A was observed as adequately clothed and groomed. No concerns regarding his care were noted. Other residents in the facility were seen moving about the facility throughout the hall. No concerns regarding their care were noted.

On 03/26/2026, I interviewed Licensee Designee (LD), Hari Singh. Licensee Singh stated that Resident A was not returned to the facility by the police, he returned on his own. However, the police did follow-up with an onsite visit to inform staff that while he was out, Resident A had gone in someone's car and took cigarettes. LD Singh denied that Resident A was assaulted nor did Resident A require medical attention. LD Singh stated that he has issued Resident A a 30-day discharge notice and for the past 2 months, he has been working with Resident A's case manager to obtain a new placement. Documents were requested.

On 03/26/2026, I received a copy of the documents requested for this investigation. The AFC Assessment Plan for Resident A indicates that Resident A doesn't communicate much, however, he can speak. The assessment plan also indicates that Resident A is able to move independently while in the community. I also received a copy of an Incident Report dated 02/28/2026.

The IR stated that on 02/28/2026, Resident A snuck out of the building, returning on his own in 10 minutes. During the time he was gone he went to neighboring businesses and got into people's cars. Police came and discussed this with the owner. As a result of this incident, staff were instructed to have someone with Resident A to prevent this from occurring again. As a corrective measure, staff will be with Resident A during waking hours.

A copy of the 30-day discharge notice issued to Resident A was also obtained. The 30-day notice issued to Resident A, signed by LD Hari Singh, dated 02/10/2026. The notice indicates that it is being issued due to behavioral concerns affecting resident safety. Resident A's last date of stay is anticipated on 03/12/2026.

On 04/27/2026, I interviewed Case Manager (CM), Alexis Bender of A & D Waiver. CM Bender stated that Resident A was moved from the Close to Home facility and placed in another home in a different county. As a result, his case has been closed. CM Bender recalled that she received at least 3 incident reports indicating that Resident A had eloped from the facility. Due to Resident A's diagnosis of Unspecified Dementia, he requires supervision while in the community. While she had no concerns regarding the care Resident A received at the facility, the elopements were a major concern, as the facility could not keep an eye on him.

On 04/27/2026, I interviewed Staff Sharonda Harris. Staff Harris recalled that Resident A was returned to the facility by the police, who indicated that Resident A was found next door at a neighboring business, attempting to enter into people's cars. Staff Harris recalled that she then contacted LD Singh and placed the call on speaker so that the police could speak with him. Staff Harris stated that it is her understanding that Resident A is not able to be out in the community alone.

On 04/27/2026, I submitted a records request to Saginaw Township Police Department, requesting a copy of any and all police reports pertaining to Resident A.

On 04/29/2026, I received a copy of the Saginaw Township Police Department Police Report #26-71800719, completed by reporting Officer Rebecca Carpus, dated 02/27/2026. The report indicates that on 02/27/2026 at 1309 hours, police were dispatched to Quest Diagnostics, located at 2062 N. Center Road, for an older black male, wearing a white sweatshirt, grey pants and orange Crocs, who had broken into one of the employees' vehicles and took some items (cigarettes). Male was last seen walking towards the assisted living home. The male involved in this incident was identified as Resident A, who officers have dealt with in the past few weeks. Officers went to Close to Home Assisted Living to contact staff and Resident A. Resident A seemed disoriented and confused. Resident A denied having any cigarettes in his possession. Resident A also denied that he had been in any vehicles. Staff stated that Resident A has gotten out multiple times by waiting at the door for someone to exit and will sneak out with them. Officers spoke with the owner, LD Singh, who advised that he has requested that Resident A be transferred to another facility.

Resident A was advised to stay out of people's vehicles; however, he did not seem to understand. Resident A stated that he wanted out of the facility and wanted to get back home to Pontiac.

On 04/29/2026, I conducted an exit conference with LD Singh who confirmed that Resident A should not be out in the community alone. I then advised LD Singh regarding properly completing of the assessment plan for residents. LD Singh was informed of the findings of this investigation.

CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

Upon the receipt of an approved corrective action plan, no change to the status of the license is recommended.
