ALLEGATION:

The facility did not have an effective pest control program.

INVESTIGATION:

On 4/22/26, I interviewed the referral source (RS) by phone. The RS reported that over the last six months the staff at Center on Aging noted Resident A had bed bugs on her clothing. The RS reported that Resident A indicated the facility had problems with bed bugs on and off for the last few years.

On 4/24/26, I conducted an on-site inspection and noted finding bed bugs in several resident bedrooms.

On 4/24/26, I interviewed Resident A at the facility. Resident A reported she had lived at the facility for "a long time." Resident A confirmed the facility had bed bugs and that the homeowner bombed the facility on a regular basis and used a professional exterminator as well.

On 4/24/26, I interviewed Residents B, C, and D at the facility. All residents confirmed that they had seen bed bugs in the facility and that the homeowner had been addressing the problem.

On 4/24/26, I interviewed Resident E at the facility. Resident E reported he had not seen any bed bugs in his bedroom.

On 4/24/26, I interviewed homeowner, Probir Bairagee at the facility. Mr. Bairagee reported they have been fighting to get rid of bed bugs for several years. Mr. Bairagee reported they always "come out" in the springtime." Mr. Bairagee reported many of the residents have gone into the community and got free clothes from various locations and brought the bed bugs into the home. Mr. Bairagee reported he has an appointment scheduled with a professional company in two weeks but planned to bomb the home this weekend. Mr. Bairagee reported another inspection will be conducted after the home is treated and signed an on-site corrective action plan.

On 4/29/26, I received and reviewed a receipt from Stratex Pest Control for the "bed bug package" treatment for the facility. The facility will get inspected and treated every three weeks as needed.

	(6) An insect, rodent, or pest control program must be maintained and carried out in a manner that continually protects the health of residents.
ANALYSIS:	It was alleged that the facility did not have an effective pest control program. Based on interviews and a home inspection this violation will be established. During an on-site inspection on 4/24/26 bed bugs were located in several resident bedrooms and most of the residents confirmed the facility had bed bugs. The homeowner also confirmed they have been dealing with bed bugs for several years and had been using several methods to correct the problem, however agreed to contact a professional exterminator to treat the facility.
CONCLUSION:	VIOLATION ESTABLISHED

On 5/28/26, I shared the findings of the investigation with licensee Probir Bairagee by phone. Mr. Bairagee acknowledged the findings and signed an on-site corrective action plan.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Based on the submission of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend no change to the current license status.
